pandemic, when these and other performance venues were forced to shut down operations for more than a year, and for many months following were only allowed to reopen at a fraction of their capacity.

John Parkhurst, Chief Operating Officer of the Rochester Broadway Theatre League, commented, "The COVID-19 shutdown of nearly two years has impacted us greatly as an industry. We are coming back, all of us, but, frankly without this coalition it would have been much harder."

In a press release, the coalition stated: "In meeting with local legislators and the Governor's office, the response has been very supportive. The coalition is grateful for that response and hopes to reach all state elected officials to assure an annual appropriation that will allow its members continue to be part of growing upstate downtowns guaranteeing accessibility for all citizens for years to come."

Chris Silva, longtime Executive Director of the Bardavon 1896 Opera House in Poughkeepsie added, "This group of performing arts centers are economic, educational and cultural engines in Upstate. We are hoping the state can make a modest investment in us that will pay huge dividends."

 Three new books will be out Sept. 12: "The Avengers," with a foreword by Bardugo; "Fantastic Four," with a foreword by Craft; and "X-Men," with a foreword by Rowell.  
 "These volumes provide unique, single-volume introductions to the first decade of The Avengers, the original X-Men, and the Fantastic Four," series editor Ben Saunders said in a statement. NEW YORK • Snoop Dogg, Gloria Estefan, who penned "Mr. Blue Sky" and "Evil Woman," Sade, Jeff Lynne, Glen Ballard, Teddy Riley and Liz Rose have been chosen to join the Songwriters Hall of Fame, a class that includes the writers of such re-visited hits as "Man in the Mirror," "Drop It Like It's Hot" and "Rhythm Is Gonna Get You."  
 The seven songwriters from the class of 2023 will be inducted at a gala June 15 at the Marriott Marquis Hotel in New York City.  
 Snoop Dogg, whose hits include "Drop It Like It's Hot" and "Gin & Juice," will be joining such rappers as Missy Elliott and Jay-Z in the hall. Estefan is credited for popularizing Latin rhythms with such crossover smashes as "Rhythm Is Gonna Get You" and "Let's Get Loud."

## Town of Red Hook Hudson Valley Community Power Electricity Supply Program in Our Town

**What is CCA?**  
Community Choice Aggregation (CCA), is a state enabled program, which offers residents and small businesses the opportunity to receive more attractive electricity supply terms through the bargaining power of aggregation (group purchasing).

**What is the Municipality's Role?**  
The Town enabled CCA through a local law and selected a program administrator.

**Who is the CCA Administrator?**  
Joule Community Power, a division of Joule Assets, who has been authorized by the state to administer CCA programs in New York.

**Does this program replace my utility company?**  
No, Central Hudson will still be responsible for billing and responding to power outages.


**Can I participate if I already have rooftop solar or community solar or hydro?**  
Yes, you can participate!

**How will my bill look?**  
You will still receive one bill from Central Hudson, but the supply section of your bill will show the name of the alternative supplier/CCA Administrator.

**What is Opt-Out Enrollment?**  
Opt-out enrollment means that you will automatically be enrolled to participate in the CCA program unless you are already receiving supply service from an alternative supplier, have a block on your account, or take action to opt-out of the program. There is no fee or penalty for opting out. Not sure if you'll be automatically enrolled? Contact us!

and never looked back," said Mount, who has Miller, a six-year-old German shepherd and Buster, a 19-month-old German shepherd.

Mount stated, "The program is great. I came for a class in 2018 and never looked back. Nose work, particularly with this methodology, opens a whole new world and relationship for dogs and their humans."

According to Mount, "For my dog Miller, I can honestly say Nose Work saved his life. He had such confidence issues that manifested in inappropriate behaviors. He is so much more balanced and gets to exercise his brain in a sport he loves."

One caveat though for the program is there is a limit to the number of participants that can be in a class.

"In order to give the dogs and handlers proper attention, the average class is limited to 6 teams per class," said Tetrault. The program is offered at Top Notch Dog Training's training center in Wappingers Falls.

Holic said, the program "really helps with confidence for shy timid dogs or even for mental stimulation for more active dogs." She added, "It's so rewarding to watch your dog succeed and grow as a team together."

Mount said, "In nose work, your dog is the lead, and you are the supporting cast. It is amazing to watch them problem solve and work out scent puzzles. I loved it so much. I went through the instructor certification program and now get to share my passion for nose work with student teams."
