What is CCA?

Community Choice Aggregation (CCA), is a state enabled program, which offers residents and small businesses the opportunity to receive more attractive electricity supply terms through the bargaining power of aggregation (group purchasing).

What is the Municipality's Role?

The Town enabled CCA through a local law and selected a program administrator.

Who is the CCA Administrator?

Joule Community Power, a division of Joule Assets, who has been authorized by the state to administer CCA programs in New York.

Does this program replace my utility company?

No, Central Hudson will still be responsible for billing and responding to power outages.

Can I participate if I already have rooftop solar or community solar or hydro?

Yes, you can participate!

How will my bill look?

You will still receive one bill from Central Hudson, but the supply section of your bill will show the name of the alternative supplier/CCA Administrator.

What is Opt-Out Enrollment?

Opt-out enrollment means that you will automatically be enrolled to participate in the CCA program unless you are already receiving supply service from an alternative supplier, have a block on your account, or take action to opt-out of the program.
